IGHT Members Meeting

Kinnererach

Issues with the sale of Kinnererach have been brought to the Board's attention by Fergus Christie via the community group which came forward to discuss the sale. These issues have been addressed as follows:

<u>Valuation</u>: The property was valued by an independent surveyor, DM Hall, who have completed many Home Reports on the island and for the Trust previously. We enquired with other organisations to complete valuations for comparison, however, all have either not responded to the enquiry or are too busy in the near future.

<u>Conflict of interest:</u> We are aware of the apparent issue of conflicts of interest but at the time of the Members Meeting these were theoretical conflicts, and as it transpires, there are no conflicts between Board members and the offers received.

<u>Viewings</u>: We can advise that the property was viewed by 12 prospective purchasers and both Directors and staff assisted with the viewings. Directors and staff have a responsibility to the Trust and the offers received further demonstrate how well the viewings were conducted.

Offers: 7 offers were received, with 1 offer being withdrawn before the Board had sight of the offers. Our Estate Agent, Stewart Balfour and Sutherland, provided their recommendation against the offers based on any conditions associated with the sale. Their recommendation was to accept the highest offer. All who submitted offers intend to become permanent residents and bring value to the island, therefore it is not possible for the Board to dispute the recommendation to accept the highest offer as this ensures a fair process for all parties involved.

The Board have therefore proceeded to offer the sale of Kinnererach to the highest offer. Details of the offer received will be confirmed once the sale is concluded.

This month we had our most attended Forest School session yet. We learned about what we can forage, cooked up some yummy bread and wild garlic pesto, made bramble, dandelion and gorse tea, and of course did the obligatory marshmallow toasting. We also held our first guided walk of the year that also focused on foraging. We looked at around 15 species that we can forage on Gigha for springtime salads, tea combinations, pesto and cakes. A HUGE THANK YOU to the food group for inviting me to give the walk and to everyone who came along, it was a lovely evening.

We are still running our conservation mornings that will aim to take place on every 3rd Friday morning of the month. Up to now we have planted 200 trees in Achamore Gardens to improve shelter belts and biodiversity, cleared vegetation from Ardminish Cist to allow for the community and visitors to view easily from the roadside and maintain our heritage sites, and undertaken some woodland management to improve habitat for woodland and farmland birds. In the summer months we will be helping the team in Achamore Gardens and doing a bit more to look after our beaches.

Achamore Gardens Update

The gardens are hitting peak Rhododendron season now with blooms appearing all over the woods, and the spring bulbs are creating a colourful splash in the walled garden. Just in time, the new Easy Access Path has been completed, which allows all visitors, but particularly those with limited mobility, pushchairs, etc to enjoy some of the best bits of the garden. This new path, funded by the Gateway to Gigha project and built by Tim Lister, winds through the garden from the main drive, leading visitors through the woods, past the pond and up to the Camellia Walk. From here visitors can walk back along the drive to the walled garden and will soon be able to exit the garden down South Drive with the installation of a new self-closing gate here.

Elsewhere, the gardens team continue to be as busy as ever, getting the gardens ready for the summer season, clearing the never ending brambles, mowing lawns and strimming paths, and sowing and growing lots of seeds and seedlings in the greenhouse. 
Achamore Gardens easy access path





The Hub
