Thursday 5th of March is World Book Day and the primary school and pre-five unit children would like to invite you along to the Village hall at 1.30pm for tea and storytelling. Donations of home baking would be gratefully received. Children will be reading their favourite story or poem. All are welcome to come along and bring their favourite book with them!

As part of their sustainability leadership activities, the school children are planning to carry out a survey within the community on the issue of dog fouling. There was a recent incident of a child arriving at school who trod on some dog excrement which had been left right outside the school gate. A quick survey of the surrounding area identified 25 incidences of dog fouling which had not been taken away by dog owners. This has prompted the children to take action against dog fouling. Please support the children in their campaign to do something about it.

Ardminish Stores announcement from Joe Teale

We are sorry to announce that from 6th March the cash machine will be withdrawn from service. Unfortunately the company that own the ATMs, YourCash (Euronet) are replacing all their Triton machines and upon replacement Post Office Counters Ltd and YourCash have decided not to continue their mutual agreement. We understand this might be a disappointment to some but you will still be able to obtain balance reports, withdraw and deposit cash at the Post Office with nearly all accounts during Post Office hours. Much effort has gone into persuading the parties concerned to make an exception for Gigha's only ATM (including involving our MP) but to no avail.

As most of you will know if either I or any of my other Post Office staff are in the shop we will be more than happy to open the PO outside the official opening hours to give you access to cash services. Please come and ask if you have any questions about this change.



Achamore Gardens blog by Susan Allan

February has been a particularly wet and windy month. It's not windy today but there has been a fair bit of rain and during a break in the rain I rushed to the gardens to do my monthly report. It is very wet underfoot and slippery in places because of fallen leaves. There has been a bit of storm damage with quite a bit of debris from the trees.

Because I was short of time I decided to concentrate my walk around the walled garden, the south drive and down to the pond. Considering the number of daffodils springing up and flowering all over the island there was a surprising lack of open daffodils in the gardens. There are one or two small rhododendrons beginning to flower but some of these have been spoilt by the weather. After a quick look there didn't appear to be anything new flowering in the walled garden but at the top of Hugh and Islay's border there is a tall Pieris with sprays of white flowers.



I have noticed while doing these walks that there are a lot more bamboos in the gardens than there used to be. The photo on the next page was near to the Malcolm Allan Garden along the road to the gate onto Achamore farm road. This road used to be wide enough for a tractor but has been over grown and is more like a footpath now. At the end of this path before turning onto the south drive is a clump of Skimmia (photo to the left) which is just coming into flower. It, like a lot of winter flowering shrubs, has a lovely scent.

I expected the south drive to be awash with Camellia flowers but only a few of them were flowering. One of which, Golden Spangles, I mentioned in my December report It was here that it started to drizzle again so I had to cover my camera for a while. I made my way to the pond garden which even in this weather was quite photogenic.

On my way back to the car I found a clump of Helleborus near to the garages. There were some snowdrops there too but they were beginning to go over.

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Campsite

The works at the Campsite will soon begin with contractors expected to be on site during the summer months this year. Shauna Cameron Architect and her Design Team will be getting all consents in place prior to this construction period. The contract for the construction will be procured publicly through a tender process. Thereafter, monthly on-site meetings will take place between IGHT, the Design Team and the contractor.
